The American Tapestry Alliance (ATA) is engaged in a wide range of educational, exhibition, outreach and promotional programs. Our programs serve the goals of our Mission Statement:

- to promote an awareness of and appreciation for woven tapestries designed and woven by individual artists
- to encourage and recognize superior quality tapestries
- to encourage educational opportunities in the field of tapestry
- to sponsor exhibitions of tapestries
- to establish a network for tapestry weavers throughout the world
- to educate the public about the history and techniques involved in tapestry making

- hosting ATA's first book club where members discussed *The Creative Act: A Way of Being*
- awarding two Awards of Excellence to Pamela Done and Patricia Armour for their exhibited work
- awarding one International Student Award to Rastislav Janardan
- organizing ATA's biannual **Postcard Exchange** featuring the work of 136 artists
- featuring **128** artists on ATA's online **Artist Directory**
- publishing **3** issues of **Tapestry Topics**, ATA's member publication featuring in-depth articles on tapestry processes, history, and latest news
- managing and updating ATA's website that serves 952 members in addition to the general public

THE YEAR AHEAD

ATA is looking forward to the opening of the inaugural exhibition, *Beyond: Tapestry Expanded* in August of 2024. *Beyond: Tapestry Expanded* is an ATA-sponsored exhibition that explores the expansive properties of tapestry. The goal of the exhibition is to feature tapestry that considers its definition beyond the boundaries of traditional French technical definition by embracing 21st century accepted definitions of tapestry within global and art historical perspectives. This initiative will bring a contemporary spotlight to the American Tapestry Alliance. Furthermore, it will introduce established and emerging artists as well as gallerists, critics, and collectors as a relevant and leading organization supporting contemporary practices within the field. *Beyond: Tapestry Expanded* will be exhibited at the Peeler Art Center at DePauw University in Greencastle, IN from **August 26 through December 9th, 2024**.

GROWTH OPPORTUNITIES


As ATA is expanding programming to meet the objectives outlined in the mission statement, we are aware of the financial impact of supporting such growth. Supporting professional artists via programs such as the **Speaker** and **Ambassador** programs, exhibitions such as **Beyond: Tapestry Expanded**, and catalogs that include critical writing centering ATA and tapestry as a legitimate field within the scope of the fine art world, requires financial support. The Board of Directors is committed to securing the financial support to further these goals. ATA is also focused on expanding diversity within the board and in our membership. However, the organization fully recognizes accessibility challenges that may impede a person's ability to explore tapestry as an artistic medium that include access to affordable equipment, quality instruction (especially since many higher educational institutions with textile programs are closing), and unencumbered time that is necessary to produce a tapestry.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW


As planned, new and expanded programming for our members has been instituted using accumulated savings. Effort was also put into grant applications which unfortunately didn't yield additional income. Expenses have increased across the board as they have everywhere. In the coming year, emphasis will be put on increasing income through fundraising and new membership while curtailing expenses as much as possible, to ensure that ATA continues to be in a healthy financial position for years to come.
